| Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference | <p>The course aims to train professionals to work in the field of interior design and furniture design. The curriculum integrates the knowledge and tools of architecture and design to provide skills for the design of spaces, fittings, furniture products, and retail.</p> <p>The program provides basic training on interior design, environmental sustainability of projects, interior architecture, fit-out design, and retail and commercial spaces. The training is complemented by practical activities, workshops, and internships in professional studios and ateliers in the interior design industry.</p> <p>The training will be divided into six modules, each composed of three subjects that will investigate the main application areas of Interior design.</p> <p>The course aims to train a professional figure in the field of interior design capable of working in the areas of Home Design, Retail Design, Exhibit Design, and Urban Design with organizational skills (defining scenarios, art direction, and coordination of the professional figures involved) and practical-design skills (furniture design and space arrangement).</p> |

| Examinations procedures and schedule | The assessment consists of examinations at the end of each module (every 4 weeks approx) with a grade expressed in thirtieths and possible mention of honors or with a pass/fail grade in some cases and communicated to the Student Administration Office by the Coordinator of the Master. |
| Final examination | The final examination consists of the definition of a project paper accompanied by a report and the portfolio of work done during the course to be presented during an interview to a committee appointed by the Executive Committee. The final test is individual, to be taken with the guidance of a lecturer or mentor on an interior design project. |

| Description of the activities and training objectives of the internship | The internship provides professional and applied experiences of the Interior Design project aimed at testing the skills acquired through attendance and exercises in the different modules. The experiences are preferably conducted at the scale of the interior design project, with the relevant graphic and application tools and with the use of the design, layout and graphics, image processing, and text software at one of the available host entities selected from professionals or companies that carry out activities in the field of Interior Design, both in the list of entities affiliated with the University of Florence and non-contracted entities that can have practical activities carried out with a different type of agreement with the promoting entity. 150 total hours of internship. |
