Jean Monnet Modules

- 1. Applicant profile: higher education institutions in any country of the world
- 2. Duration: 3 years, with a minimum duration of 40 teaching hours per academic year
- **3.** Maximum grant: €30,000 (maximum 75% of the total costs)

What qualifies as a Jean Monnet Module in Higher Education?

- A short teaching programme or course in the field of European Union studies, focusing on one particular discipline or multidisciplinary in approach, and being one of the following:
- general or introductory courses on European Union issues (in particular at institutions and faculties that do not yet have a highly developed course offering in the field);
- > specialised teaching on European Union developments (in particular at institutions and faculties that do already have a highly developed course offering in the field); or
- > summer and intensive courses

To do list

Bring innovative, interesting and specific EU content

Disseminate and exploit the results beyond the scope of the stakeholders directly involved

Publish at least one peer reviewed article during the grant period

Participate in dissemination and information events

Organise events with policy makers at local, regional and national level

Involve the general public and civil society
