Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference	<p>The course aims to train professionals who can effectively identify, analyze and intervene in cognitive, affective, and relational processes related to learning in situations of typicality, risk, specific learning disorders, and other neurodevelopmental disorders: ADHD, autism, speech and language disorders, intellectual disability and in cases of Special Educational Needs. The Master course provides tools for promoting and managing school-family relationships and designing pathways for school well-being.</p> <p>The skills and knowledge provided by the Master course can be spent in diagnosis (for psychologists and speech-language pathologists), learning assessment, intervention, design of reinforcement pathways, psycho-educational support relationship, and homework and study.</p> <p>To this end, training will be divided into activities focused on current theories, methods, and tools with attention to research findings, for assessment and intervention on cognitive, emotional, and motivational aspects underlying learning, social-relational development, Learning Difficulties and Disorders, and neurodevelopment in the school context.</p>
