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Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference	<p>The Course aims to train nurse specialists in pediatric and neonatal nursing. Nurse Practitioners with a Level I Master Diploma in Pediatric Nursing are the professionals described in the Ministerial Decree 739/1994. They have acquired additional specialized skills to deliver nursing care to persons of developmental age, complementing and working alongside the Pediatric Nurse Practitioner in hospital and territorial pediatrics.</p> <p>These skills enable them to identify the care needs of developing-age individuals and to plan, manage and evaluate care intervention; to ensure the proper application of the pediatrician's diagnostic and therapeutic services; to carry out health education, health promotion and prevention interventions aimed at the child and their family; and to deliver outpatient, home and hospital nursing care.</p> <p>According to Law Feb. 1, 2006, No. 43, the Nurse Practitioner with a Professional Master Diploma in Pediatric Nursing is a Nurse Specialist in the pediatric area.</p> <p>The Pediatric Nurse Specialist may work in all social welfare and health care settings, public and private, and may also engage in freelance practice in accordance with current regulations.</p> <p>To this end, the training activities will be divided into four blocks, a clinical internship and possible workshops. Each block is divided into Learning Units. By the end of the Course, learners will have acquired the knowledge and skills necessary to deliver nursing care appropriate to the health needs of the child and their family.</p>
Access prerequisites	Bachelor's degree obtained in accordance with the system under Ministerial Decree No. 270/2004 or Ministerial Decree No. 509/1999 in Nursing - L/SNT1 Class of Degrees in Nursing and Midwifery Health Professions, or equivalent degrees pursuant to Law No. 1/2002 or Law No. 1/2002, provided they are combined with a high school diploma.

Duration	10 months
Teaching methods	Teaching will be delivered in blended mode; for distance learning, lectures will be synchronous and asynchronous, depending on the specifics, using Moodle and Webex platforms.
Language of instruction	Italian and English for some workshops
Attendance requirements	Attendance is mandatory for 70% of the total hours of the Course.

Location of the Course	The face-to-face teaching activities take place at the Morgagni Educational Center, Viale Morgagni, 44 Florence.
Foreseen lecture schedule	Classes will run on fivedays a week, Monday through Friday.
Examinations procedures and schedule	The assessment of educational activities consists of examinations with a grade expressed in thirtieths and possible mention of honors or with a pass/fail grade in some cases and communicated to the Student Administrative Office by the Coordinator of the Master. Exams will be conducted at the end of each block and at the end of the internship period.
Final examination	The final examination consists of a presentation of an original written work, accompanied by an oral report.

Description of the activities and training objectives of the internship	At the end of the internship period, the student should be able to: Distinguish the nursing care peculiarities of the child with acute and chronic health problems and his or her family. Plan and evaluate nursing interventions necessary for the needs of the child and his or her family from the time of admission to the time of discharge or possible transfer to another health or community facility. Assess and plan interventions suitable for the prevention and treatment of acute and chronic pain in children. Define and plan interventions to prevent or treat anxiety in the hospitalized child and his or her family. Prepare and administer drug therapy to the sick child according to good clinical practice. Observational activity. 250 total hours of internship.
