Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference	The Course aims to develop advanced skills in wound care, necessary for the management of individuals at risk or carrying skin ulcers in different age groups
Access prerequisites	Bachelor's degree obtained under the system pursuant to Ministerial Decree No. 270/2004 (or pursuant to Ministerial Decree No. 509/1999 equated under D.I. July 9, 2009) in Nursing-L/SNT1 Class of degrees in nursing and midwifery health professions, or equivalent degree pursuant to Law No. 1/2002 or Law 240/2020 provided it is combined with a high school diploma. The knowledge of Italian by foreign candidates is assessed by the Executive Committee or a Commission specially appointed by it, including through the production of appropriate certifications. Teaching methods	Teaching activities are conducted in person or remotely or both.
Language of instruction	Italian
Verification of knowledge of the language in which the course is delivered	For foreign students, a C1 level of knowledge of the Italian language is required, which must be verified by submitting an appropriate certification.
Attendance requirements	Attendance is mandatory for 75% of the total hours of the Course.
Location of the Course	In-person lectures are held at the Morgagni Campus, Viale Morgagni, 40/44 - 50134 Florence or other university classrooms located in the Careggi University Hospital (AOUC) or the classrooms of the N.I.C. (New Careggi Entrance) Pavilion 3 - Education, Largo Brambilla, 3 - 50134 Florence. The internship is carried out, subject to the stipulation of a special agreement or other type of agreement with the University of Florence, in selected host organizations among hospitals and Local Health Authorities: - Careggi University Hospital, Largo Brambilla 3, Florence; - Local health authority Toscana Centro, P.zza S. Maria Nuova 1, Florence.
Foreseen lecture schedule	Classes will be held every other week with a 3-4 days commitment (8 hours/day).
Examinations procedures and schedule	The assessment of educational activities consists of examinations with a grade expressed in thirtieths and possible mention of honors or with a pass/fail grade in some cases.
Final examination	The final examination consists of the presentation of a paper.

Description of the activities and training objectives of the internship	<p>Learning Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assess the level of risk of developing skin ulcers • Conduct an in-depth targeted assessment inherent in the various risk factors for the occurrence of skin lesions • Identify the most appropriate prevention strategies for the case based on evidence of effectiveness • Conduct an in-depth targeted assessment inherent in the various risk factors for the occurrence of skin lesions • Use scales to assess and classify skin lesions • Develop the ability to choose appropriate therapeutic strategies based on evidence of effectiveness • Developing skills in the selection and evaluation of preps for the treatment of skin ulcers • Use the specific wound-care methods and tools, evaluating their appropriateness and effectiveness • Monitor the effectiveness of adopted interventions • Manage the care plan, sharing it with those involved in the care pathway • Educate patients and family members, where their involvement is necessary and possible, about the use of the tools for prevention and treatment • Identify how the management of information flows inherent in skin injury prevention and treatment takes place • Identify diagnostic and therapeutic care pathways geared toward the prevention and treatment of people with skin ulcers <p>Observational activity. 275 total hours of internship.</p>
