Jean Monnet actions are an important part of UNIFI internationalization strategy

The Jean Monnet actions....

- offer opportunities in the field of **higher education** as well as in **other fields of education and training**
- contribute to spreading knowledge about the **European Union integration matters**
- are managed by the European Education and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA)
- UNIFI has been at the forefront, getting projects financed since 1995 (Cogliandro, Vassori and in 1996 DiNolfo)

The Jean Monnet initiatives

- aim to foster the **introduction of a European Union perspective** in education
- seek to **strengthen European identity** and promote active citizenship among students and teachers.
- By integrating EU-related subjects—such as democracy, EU history, functioning of the EU, and cultural diversity—into the curriculum, **the initiatives encourage a deeper understanding of the EU among young learners**

Wide choice of actions: Modules, Chairs, or Centres of Excellence, also network

- **Modules are short teaching programmes** in the field of European Union studies (40 teaching hours per academic year for a duration of three years). Could also take the form of short specialised or summer programmes
- **Chairs are teaching posts with a specialisation in European Union studies** (90 teaching hours per academic year). The Chair may also have a team to support and enhance the activities
- **Jean Monnet Centres of Excellence are focal points of competence and knowledge on European Union subjects** and have a major role in reaching out to students from faculties not normally dealing with European Union issues as well as to policy makers, civil servants, organized civil society and general public
- **As Jean Monnet beneficiary, one has to organize activities and events that ensure openness to policy makers, civil servants, civil society and the general public at large**

UNIFI has been a very early member of the JM community!

- In today's interventions, you'll find out the experience of colleagues that have been amongst the first to have a JM chair/ a JM center of excellence... **(the JM started in 1989, UNIFI in 1995)!**
- So far, JM financed around 9,000 university teachers and more than 1,000 universities in around 100 countries
- UNIFI has always been participating and got over 50 projects financed
